



The mythology of Law and Justice's (PiS) migration discourse

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"We should carefully study the origin, the structure, the methods, and the technique of the political myths. We should see the adversary face to face in order to know how to combat him."

- ERNST CASSIRER, "THE MYTH OF THE STATE"

Analytical lens

- Myth a special form of thinking and as an expression of collective emotions (Cassirer, Eliade)
- Always uses a certain group of people as the hero or protagonist (Tudor)
- A fundamental feature is the emotional bias (Boticci):

"If a myth reflects a truth, it is primarily a truth of emotions. A real myth can never be a pure intellectual creation, a living myth must be expressed emotionally."

As long as something in reality has a sense, a higher purpose, meaning, is ascribed values – it has traces of a myth. (Kołakowski)

Analytical lens

"Myth is made according to plan. The new political myths do not grow up freely; they are not wild fruits of an exuberant imagination. They are artificial things fabricated by very skilful and cunning artisans"

- Ernst Cassirer, The Myth of the State

Basic functions of myth

- 1) the consolatory function to give meaning and hope, to overcome grief and suffering
- 2) the integrating function to crate the feeling of belonging to a group, apart from other people
- 3) the mobilising function to activate collective memory and to call for repetition of deeds

Myth in PiS migration discourse: SECURITY

- "The most important is the <u>security</u> of Poland and Poles"
- "After recent events related to <u>acts of terror</u> we will not accept refugees, because there is no mechanism, which would ensure security"
- Prime Minister Beata Szydło has <u>firmly stated</u> today that in the matter of refugees, <u>Poland will not allow</u> to be <u>intimidated by the European</u> <u>Commission</u>.

The <u>security</u> of the <u>region</u>, <u>Poles and the Visegrad Group</u> is our priority and we will never agree to <u>blackmail</u> and <u>dictating</u> such conditions."

Myth in PiS migration discourse: US vs THEM

- 'us' or 'self' PiS government, by extension Poland 'extended self' - Visegrad 4, sometimes wider Central and Eastern Europe or new EU Member States who struggle against
- 'them' "old EU", Western European countries, or "Brussels elites" who are perceived to protect their interest at the cost of the new members

Myth in PiS migration discourse: Demonizing the EU

- "Attempts to force joint responsibility for the decision on the opening of borders, which <u>Angela Merkel</u> has taken in an <u>authoritarian</u> manner and in <u>violation</u> of all EU procedures, is a <u>complete mistake</u> of Brussels."
- "This propaganda about success [of relocation programs] from the European Commission... for many people it was a wake up call showing the <u>hypocrisy</u> of the <u>Brussels elites</u>."
- "...at the level of media and society [in Germany] there is a constant <u>nonsensical attack</u> on Poland and supporting the opposition...The claim that the <u>German government</u> does not have any influence over the media is a claim, to put it mildly, detached from reality"

Myth in PiS migration discourse: Demonizing the EU

"Poland ... has become a comfortable "whipping boy". <u>The decision makers of the "old EU</u>", irritated by <u>Poland's strong opposition</u> to the <u>forced</u> relocation of refugees in our country, <u>imposed</u> on us <u>unfavorable rhetoric</u> in their national media, which in turn has a clear impact on sentiments in the society. As a consequence, in the societies of the "<u>old EU</u>" the <u>antipathy to our country</u> persists or is even growing...

A strong EU is Poland's interest - but not the <u>EU polarized between the</u> <u>"poor relatives from the East" and the "old elite</u>"

Myth in PiS migration discourse: Demonizing the EU

"...by [not] accepting the <u>forced</u> relocation of <u>migrants</u>, we win the <u>security</u> of our own citizens.
People in Poland, in public places, <u>feel safe</u>.
At least a lot <u>safer than in Western Europe</u>.
They do not <u>live in fear</u>
that every night out on the beach or an evening walk can <u>end in a tragedy</u>."

"We show that you can pursue a different policy and <u>live without fear of terrorist attacks</u>. This is an example for the leaders of some <u>countries that are so dangerous</u>, that <u>regardless of the invocation of reality</u>, the frustration of societies affected by these misfortunes is growing.

They look at the map and see where it is different. And they ask – how come they can live there normally?

In the name of what do we give away our <u>security</u>, the shape of <u>European civilization</u>? I often hear such voices... I hear <u>admiration for Poland</u> that was <u>able to say "no"</u> to <u>bad</u> projects, that we are today a <u>beautiful</u>, <u>safe</u>, <u>attractive country</u>."

Myth in PiS migration discourse: a threat to nation's sovereignty

- "Such a decision would <u>abolish the sovereignty</u> of the <u>weaker</u> Member States of the European Union. We cannot agree to this. We <u>must oppose</u>, because we are and will be <u>masters in our own land</u>."
- "Sovereign states must have the ability to decide who they accept"
- "We take the position that all EU countries have a duty to <u>guarantee full sovereignty of borders</u> and that <u>we, the Republic of Poland, decide</u> who we want to accept, whom we want to accept temporarily, and whom we do not want to accept"
- "The policy of <u>pressure</u> from the European Union is being applied. We can not give in to it."

Myth in PiS migration discourse: The hero of Poland and Poland as hero

- "As Poland, from the very beginning we have consistently and with great <u>courage</u> raised [this question] and <u>we were not afraid</u> to start discussions on this subject [relocation mechanism]. The entire Visegrad is of such opinion at the moment."
- "As long as I am Prime Minister, there will be no Polish consent to this [refugee relocation]. <u>They</u> [the EU] <u>will not break us</u>"
- "If it were not for the Government of Law and Justice and a tough policy in this matter, the Poles would not feel safe today"

Myth in PiS migration discourse: The enemy of the people - PO

- [Platforma Obywatelska (PO) government accepted EU relocation] "against the countries of <u>Central and Eastern Europe</u>, <u>against</u> the <u>V4</u> <u>countries</u>"
- "PO is not a party that would be able to conduct a <u>sovereign migration</u> <u>policy</u> and a <u>sovereign policy towards the EU</u>, to present Polish arguments in Brussels."

Myth in PiS migration discourse: The enemy of the people – Tusk

- "the candidacy of Donald Tusk is <u>convenient from the point of view of Western countries</u> that <u>want to get rid of immigrants</u>... He behaved as if he was a very <u>loyal functionary of the European Union</u>, who <u>pursues German interests</u>. Chancellor Merkel is now pushing Donald's candidacy..."
- "High treason ... refers to the most serious crime that can be committed. But, gentlemen, it is necessary to recall what Donald Tusk has done with the idea of punishing countries opposing the admission of refugees with the fine of 250,000 euros per person."
- "...as the head of this body [the European Council], he does not focus on solving the migration problem, but on the <u>fighting the Polish government</u> and the Hungarian government"

Myth in PiS migration discourse: the promise of salvation

"Together, we can influence the fate of Europe"

- "The fact that the decision to relocate immigrants has not been extended, but is <u>dying a natural death</u>, is for Poland above all a sign that the <u>European Commission is not deaf to the arguments of the</u> <u>Visegrad Group</u>. Patiently repeated arguments <u>brought the expected</u> <u>results...</u>"
- "I am glad that the President of the European Council is <u>starting to speak</u> <u>like Poland</u> in the context of refugees"

Myth in PiS migration discourse: alternative solidarity

"We want to help, but there on the spot"

"We owe the truth to those who died in <u>Auschwitz</u>...Referring to the situation in the Middle East, she reminded that people in a war-torn country need to be <u>helped but on the spot</u>...You have to create a decent living environment for them. The current <u>European Union policy towards refugees is not effective</u>...We wonder if this is the way that will really help refugees, if it is not <u>better - as Poland is doing right now</u> - to help there on the spot, like when we get involved providing medical help ...our country is involved, among others in the construction of hospitals."

Myth in PiS migration discourse: conclusions

- An overwhelming appeal to emotion, and very little appeal to rationality
- ▶ The central conflict: US (Poland) vs them (EU)
- PiS and Poland are heroes, protagonists
- Refugees are a security threat, antagonists
- EU is an usurper, antagonist
- Migration policy a zero-sum game, realist approach
- PO and Tusk enemies of the people
- Alternative solidarity and the promise of salvation to Poland, and Europe, and refugees
