
Why Cats?

- 1) Cats are part of the populist strategy of presenting leaders as 'one of the people'
- 2) Pictures of cats get more social media coverage than overtly political posts
- 3) It's not just cats it can be dogs, food, sports teams or a whole host of other non-political features
- 4) It's part of a strategy to soften the image of politicians promoting divisive and discriminatory political views





'Cossack House' is a cultural centre in Kyiv which hosts events organized by far right groups such as Azov Battalion









They also organise summer camps for Ukrainian children to learn survival skills and about 'patriotism'



Plomin use various social media strategies to attract attention to their club. But even posts containing pictures of young women reading books are not as popular as...





The Ukrainian far right focus heavily on community building to increase support through non-political means (Polyakova, 2014)

This increases plausible deniability for extreme political views

It contributes to the increased blurring of lines between patriotism and ethno-centric nationalism
